## Discuss

- 1. Dave and Ann explain there are three main biblical purposes of sex: Procreation, Oneness and Pleasure. What happens when there is an imbalance and only one of these is a priority?
- 2. Read Genesis 2:24-25. Think about the statement "a man and his wife become one flesh".
  - How could this idea of "oneness" represent a depth of intimacy that is beyond the physical act of sex?
  - What are the benefits of sex being more than just a physical act, but intimacy of the soul within a committed marriage?

## 3. Read Proverbs 5: 18-19 and Discuss:

- The word "wife" in this scripture reminds us that God reserves sex for the intimacy of marriage. This idea is counter to our culture. Is God being a spoil-sport with this boundary or does he have a purpose that benefits us?
- This scripture very clearly references intimate parts of our body. Does it surprise you to find this in the Bible? Did God actually create sex for pleasure?
- Words like rejoice, satisfy and captivate suggest that God designed sex to be something wonderful and even fun! Explore your own view of what you believe God thinks about sex. If it's a negative view, where did that idea come from?
- 4. How does understanding the fact that women bring all their baggage of the day with them to the bedroom and men don't change your understanding of your spouse? How does learning that sex basically starts before the act change the way you think about the role of sex in your marriage?
- 5. **Read Song of Solomon 7:12.** This verse reminds us that God designed sex to be creative and fun. How cool is that?!
  - Does this influence your view of the role of sex in your marriage any differently?
  - What are the dangers of thinking that sex is unimportant in our marriage?
- 6. God made men and women different, right? These differences reveal themselves in many areas of marriage, especially in the area of sex. How does this change your view of the way God sees your marriage and intimacy?
- 7. As you reflect on today's topic of sex, what is your biggest takeaway or realization? Why?

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## Challenge

"If there is ever an area of marriage in which we need to invite the vertical perspective, it is into our sex lives. Otherwise, sex becomes all about us. And then something God uniquely designed to help, heal, and bond us together becomes instead something that damages, wounds, and drives us apart."
